



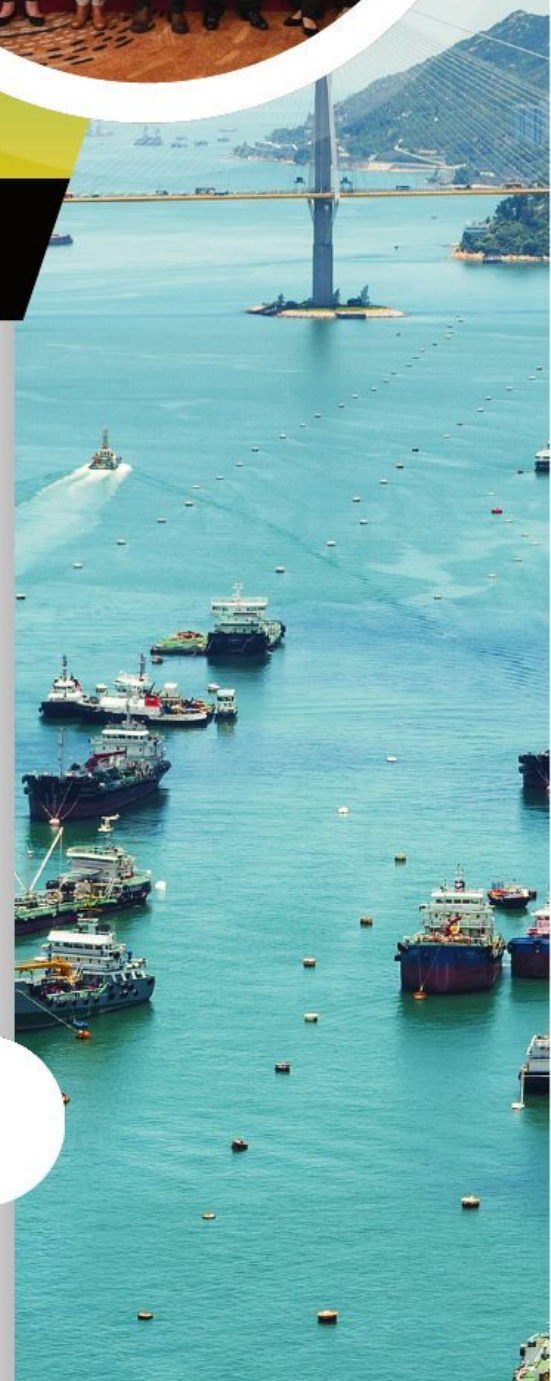

1.2 JCI History

JCI's story begins with Henry Giessenbier Jr., a young man living in St. Louis, Missouri, USA, during a time of incredible growth and change. Giessenbier recognized the talents and passions of the young people around him, and envisioned the positive change they could create if they had the right resources.

By the age of 18, Henry Giessenbier Jr. formed the Herculaneum Dance Club, a social outlet for the community's youth. Unknown at the time, Giessenbier was laying the foundation for what would become a global movement.

On October 13, 1915, the first JCI Movement was founded when 32 men joined to form the Young Men's Progressive Association (YMPCA) at the Mission Inn located in their hometown of St. Louis, USA.

Until now, JCI members span more than 5,000 communities in over 100 countries. Through local initiatives and international collaboration, we create a ripple effect of change that transcends borders and cultures.

1.3 Prominent JCI Members and Alumni

Do you know Bill Clinton is only just one of the five Jaycee members who have been the presidents of United States? Do you know six Japan Prime Ministers have been the members of JCI?

Being a global organisation with the mission to provide development opportunities to empower the young generation to create positive change for over 100 years, JCI has nurtured many socially recognized leaders around the globe. Though they come from different backgrounds and nations, they all have one thing in common: they are all former members of JCI.

1.4 JCI Opportunities

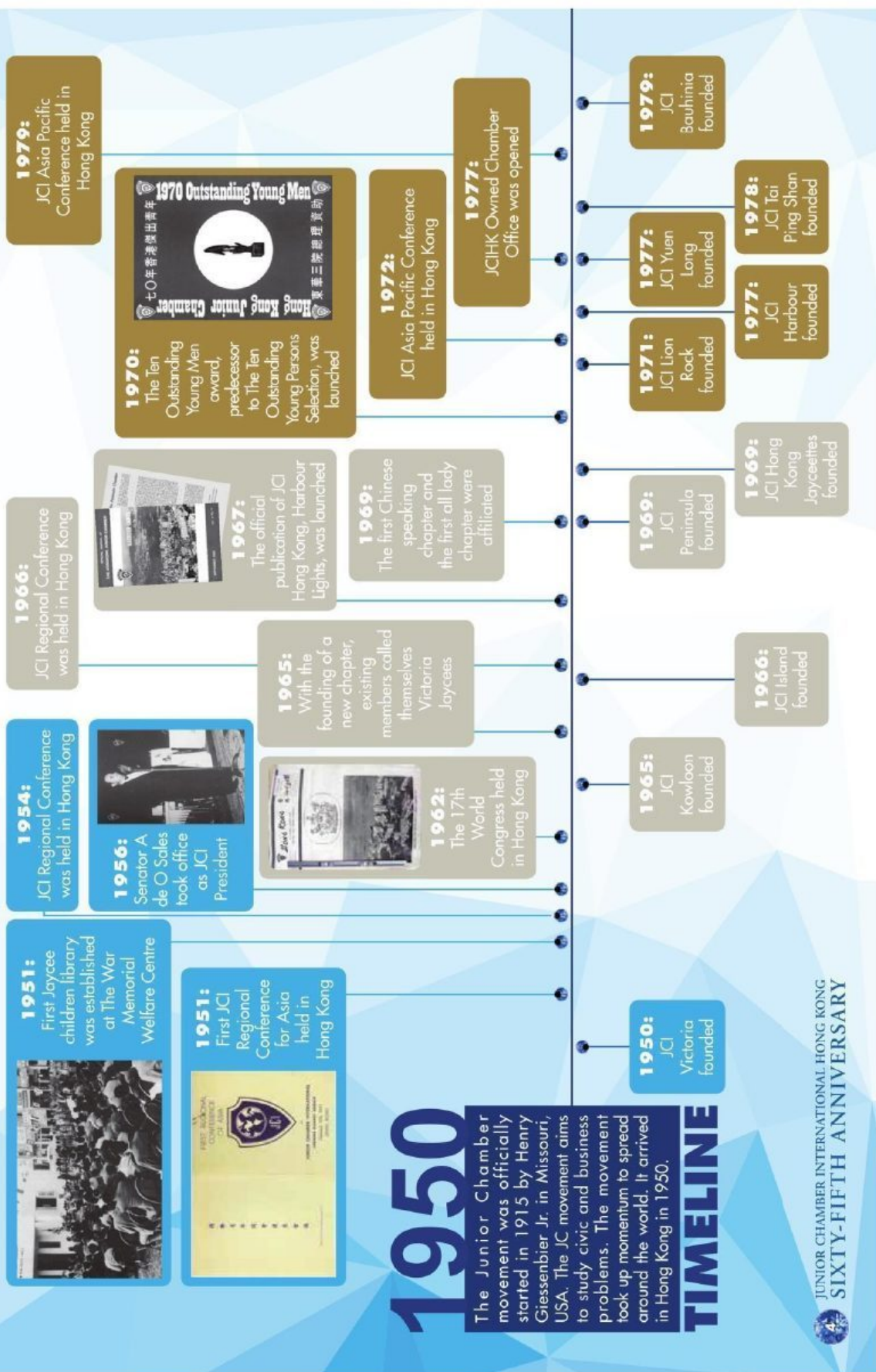

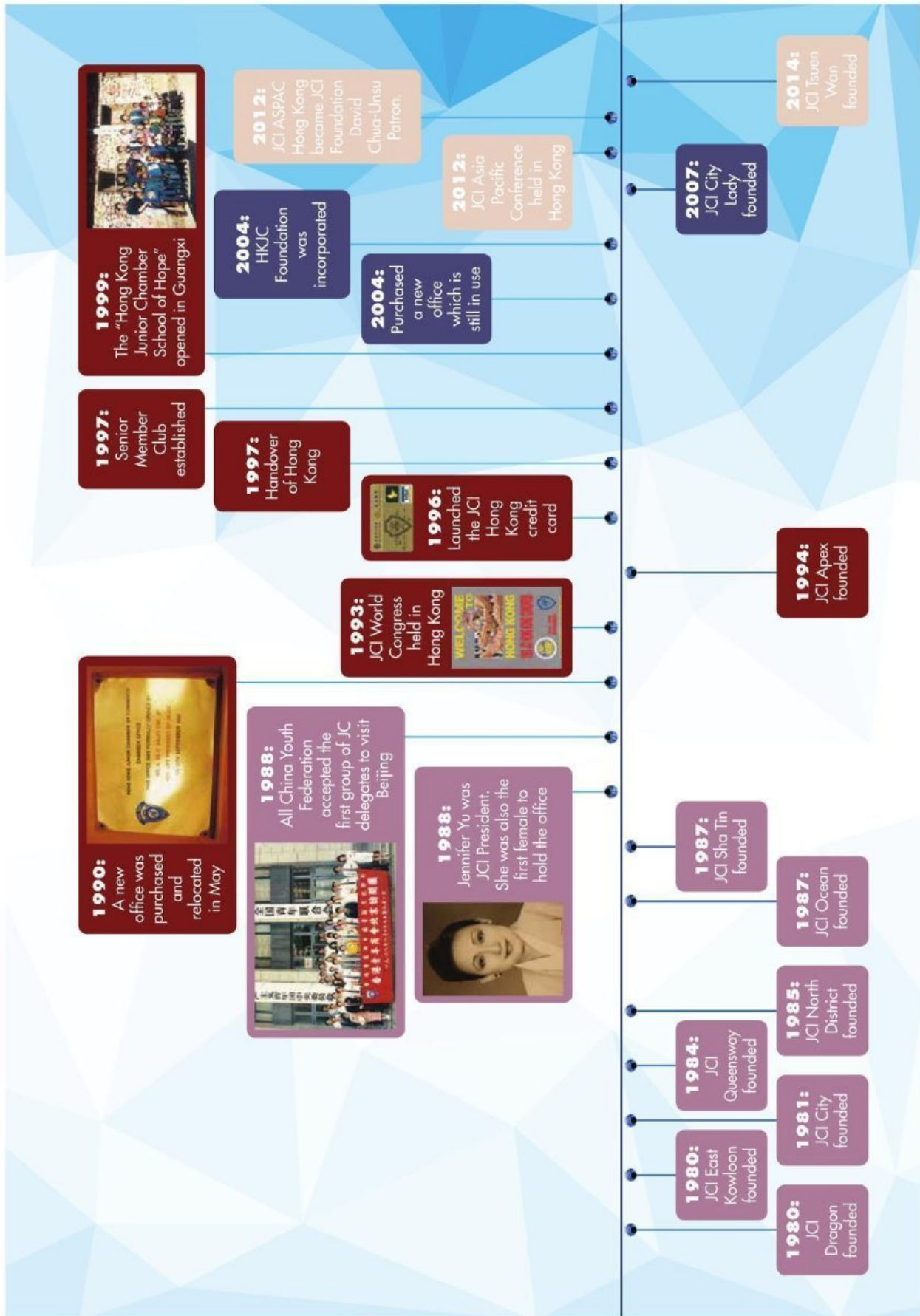

3. Introduction of Junior Chamber International Queensway (JCI Queensway/ QJC)

It was formed, for the first time in the history of JCIHK, by a group of prospective members with the assistance of a few senior members on **14th April 1984**. JCI Queensway is a mixed chapter using **English** as the official language.

3.1 How JCI Queensway Got Its Name

Back in **1984**, JCI Hong Kong invited our **Charter President, Senator Rainbow Li**, to create a new chapter with two special features:

- It would use **English** as the official language
- It would **welcome both men and women**

When choosing a name, CP Senator Rainbow and the founding team followed the JCIHK tradition of using a Hong Kong place name. They wanted something unique — something no other chapter had. So they searched for a place starting with the letter “**Q**”, because no JCI chapter in Hong Kong used that letter.

After exploring different options, they chose Queensway, a well-known road in Admiralty and one of Hong Kong’s important business districts.

Later, CP Senator Rainbow discovered something even more meaningful:

- **Queensway Road** lies close to the intersection of major longitude and latitude lines on the Hong Kong map.

This inspired the elegant and beautiful Chinese name 「經緯」:

- 「經」 = longitude
- 「緯」 = latitude

Longitude and latitude cross to form a global network — a perfect symbol of connection, diversity, teamwork, and international vision.

It matched exactly what the founders wanted:

- a chapter where young people from different backgrounds come together, learn, and grow in an English-speaking, international environment.

And thus, the chapter was proudly named:

- **JCI Queensway** in English
- 「經緯青年商會」 in Chinese

A name that carries history, culture, and a global mindset — the spirit of who we are today.

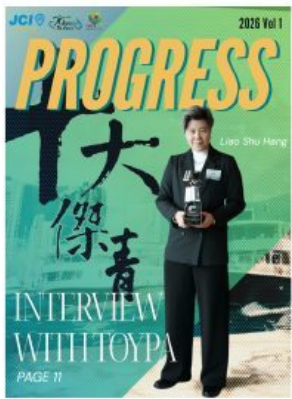
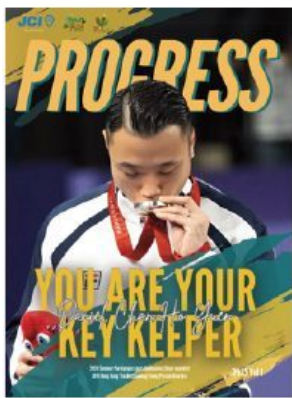
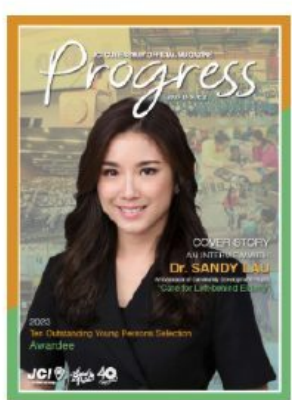

Section 2) JCI Queensway Members Guide

4.1 How to Become a JCI Queensway Member?

Any person who is between the age of 18 to 40 years of age, has a proper occupation, profession or employment, and is of good character, who accepts the Creed of Junior Chamber International and the object of the Association and who intends to become a **Full Member** of the Association in due course, shall be eligible to apply to become a **Prospective Member** of the Association.

To convert into an Full Member of JCI Queensway, Prospective Members need to:

Mandatory (All requirements must be completed)

- ✓ Attend one Prospective Member Orientation (PMO)
- ✓ Complete the application form and payment of the prospective member fee
- ✓ Attend one Monthly Fellowship Gathering (MFG)
- ✓ Serve as an Organizing Committee member for **one project**
- ✓ Go through an interview/examination by the Board of Directors
- ✓ Be able to recite the JC Creed, Mission and Vision
- ✓ Approval of membership by the Board of Directors
- ✓ Pay annual membership dues (on pro-rata basis)
- ✓ Attend the Induction Ceremony and officially become a Full Member

By completing the above requirements, you have taken an important step in understanding the JCI and preparing yourself to be an active, contributing member.

4.2 Learning Opportunities

JCI has a global leadership structure with a **"One Year to Lead"** philosophy, allowing members to take on leadership roles at various levels.

Your JCI journey follows **progressive ladders**. You begin by learning and contributing within JCI Queensway, and as you develop your skills, new opportunities open for you to serve at the JCIHK level. With continued growth, you may even take on regional or international roles.

Taking a NOM Post: Contribution to Local Chapter

For all candidates who take NOM positions or take part in NOM activities, we look forward to the person sharing his/her learning with other QJC members and growing more leaders in the mother chapter.

Therefore, the following activities are recommended:

- Sit in board meetings
- Conduct sharing and training sessions during board meetings and monthly fellowship gatherings
- Help in Signature Project
- Take senior posts in projects to mentor new members

Procedures

1. Indicate interest to ExCom / President
2. ExCom / President to assess the intention and preference of the applicant
3. President submits the application to the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC)
4. LRPC consolidates all feedback and provides a recommendation
5. Board considers LRPC's recommendation and makes a motion during the Board meeting
