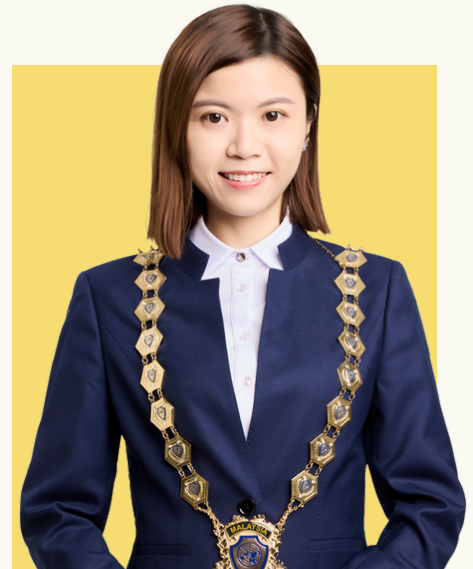

An Interview with Daniel Chan Ho Yuen

2024 Summer Paralympics para-badminton Silver medalist
2019 Hong Kong Ten Outstanding Young Person Awardee



YOU ARE YOUR KEY KEEPER

在體育界，有些故事超越了運動成就的界限，展現了堅韌、決心和人類精神的力量。香港的輪椅羽毛球運動員陳浩源正是這樣的例子。他目前排名世界第二，並在2024年巴黎殘奧會上勇奪銀牌後，為其非凡的職業運動員生涯畫上了圓滿的句號。回顧過去，他認為2008年的車禍是改變他一生的轉捩點。

「意外發生後，我的人生變得更加不一樣。我成為了一名殘疾人士，並在醫院裡度過了11個月，接受了近100次大大小小的手術。那時是我人生的低谷。」在重新融入社會的過程中充滿挑戰，工作機會十分有限。他無法從事體力勞動，然而，陳浩源從他童年對運動的熱愛中找到了希望。「我從小就相信，每個人都應該有一項能陪伴一生的運動。我以前熱愛踢足球和打羽毛球。最終，我從一個羽毛球興趣班開始，並一步步成為兩屆殘奧會輪椅羽毛球獎牌得主。」



In the world of sports, there are stories that transcend the boundaries of athletic achievements—stories of resilience, determination, and the power of the human spirit. Daniel Chan, a para-badminton athlete from Hong Kong, embodies this spirit. Currently ranked second in the world, Daniel recently clinched a silver medal at the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games, marking the pinnacle of his remarkable career. In this exclusive interview, Daniel shares his journey of overcoming adversity, his reflections on life, and his vision for the future.

A Life-Changing Turning Point

Reflecting on his journey, Daniel identified the car accident in 2008 as the turning point that reshaped his life.

"I grew up in public housing, not wealthy but a healthy and happy boy. At that time, I was a senior secondary student living an ordinary life," Daniel recalls. "After the accident, life became much more difficult. First, I became a person with a disability and spent 11 months in the hospital, undergoing nearly 100 surgeries. It was the lowest point in my life."

His transition back into society was full of challenges. Job opportunities were hard to find, as he was unable to perform labor-intensive tasks or sales roles. Yet, Daniel found a silver lining in his childhood love for sports. "As a child, I believed everyone should have a sport to accompany them for life. I used to love playing soccer and badminton. Eventually, I started with a badminton interest class and went on to become a two-time Paralympic para-badminton medalist."



Turning Challenges into Opportunities

Daniel's road to success was anything but smooth. When asked about his approach to failure and adversity, he shares, "When I was 22 or 23 years old, I struggled to accept the reality of my situation. Fortunately, I encountered good people and good experiences. My mom and my then-girlfriend, now my wife, supported me strongly and gave me immense strength."



He emphasizes the importance of self-reflection and finding purpose. "As a person with a disability, I often asked myself what I hoped to become and achieve. Of course, I wished I could go back to a time before the accident, but I knew that was impossible. I wanted to be proud of my life again, to earn respect, and to take care of my family. At the same time, I wanted to change the perception of those who looked down on disabled athletes."

Over the years, Daniel has consistently broken barriers, winning a bronze medal at the 2021 Tokyo Paralympics and a silver medal at the 2024 Paris Paralympics. "Over 16 years, I've continuously made history for Hong Kong," he proudly states.

陳浩源的成功之路絕並不平坦。談到他面對失敗和逆境的態度時，他說：「在22或23歲時，我很難接受自己的處境。幸運的是，我遇到了好人和好經歷。我的媽媽和當時的女朋友（現在的妻子）給了我強大的支持和力量。」

他強調了自我反思和尋找人生目標的重要性。「作為一名殘疾人士，我經常問自己，我希望成為怎樣的人，又能實現什麼目標。我曾經希望能回到事故發生之前，但我知道這是不可能的。我希望重新站起來，贏得尊重，並照顧好我的家人。同時，我也希望改變那些看不起殘疾運動員的人的看法。」

多年來，他不斷突破障礙，於2021年東京殘奧會奪得銅牌，並在2024年巴黎殘奧會贏得銀牌。他滿懷自豪地說「16年間，我不斷為香港創造歷史。」





保持積極的心態是陳浩源成功的關鍵。他將這部分歸功於妻子，認為她是他生活中穩定且激勵他進步的力量。「我是一個容易自滿的人，但幸運的是我的妻子非常理性，且標準很高。只有在我獲得『傑出運動員獎』、入選『十大傑出青年』以及贏得兩枚殘奧會獎牌時，她才會給我一些肯定。」這種自我反思和對目標的堅持，幫助他在運動員和人生角色中不斷成長。「她的提醒促使我不斷進步，實現目標。」作為一名運動員，陳浩源亦經歷了許多起跌。「我曾經害怕面對自己的失敗。例如，我不願看比賽中失分的錄像，甚至覺得錄像中的那個人不是我自己。」他坦言，「後來，我明白從那些失敗時刻中改進，才是我進步和未來成功的關鍵。」

當被問及人生哲學時，他分享了一句競逐『十大傑出青年』時提出的座右銘：「用有限的身體，創造無限的可能。」近年來，許多人詮釋了這句話的深意。我曾經為殘疾人士舉辦過一個名為『演我』的演講工作坊。我發現，大多數年輕人都在『表演別人』，而不是『表演自己』；按照老師或長輩的期望而活。我希望他們能真實地活出自己，成為自己的第一名。」

Staying Positive Amid Life's Ups and Downs

Maintaining a positive outlook is key to Daniel's success. He credits his wife for being a grounding and motivating force in his life. "My wife and I review our life every three years to see if we're progressing or regressing," he shares. "I'm someone who can get complacent easily, but luckily, my wife is very rational and has high standards. She only acknowledged me when I received the Outstanding Athlete Award, was named one of the Ten Outstanding Young Persons, and won two Paralympic medals."

This practice of reflection and accountability has helped Daniel grow, both as an athlete and as a person. "Her reminders helped push me to improve further and achieve my goals."

Facing Adversity Without Giving Up

As an athlete, Daniel has faced his fair share of ups and downs. "I used to fear confronting my own failures. For example, after matches, I was reluctant to watch recordings of my lost points and even felt like the person in the video wasn't me," he admits. "Later, I realized that improving from those moments of failure was the key to my progress and future success."

A Motto to Live By

When asked about his life philosophy, Daniel shares a powerful motto: "Use a limited body to achieve unlimited possibilities."

He elaborates, "This is the motto I came up with when I was nominated for the Ten Outstanding Young Persons Award. In recent years, many people have been able to live out the meaning of this phrase. I once organized a workshop for people with disabilities called 'Performing Myself.' I found that most young people are 'performing others' instead of themselves, living according to the expectations of their teachers or elders. I hope they can break away from them and becoming their own number one. Take for examples So Wa Wai, Kong Man Wai, Cheung Ka Long, or me—we all created our own paths and worlds."





A New Chapter

After the Paris Paralympics, Daniel announced his retirement, but his journey is far from over. He plans to establish a school to support individuals with physical disabilities or special education needs.

"Aging and injuries were the main reasons for my retirement," Daniel explains. "I had already considered retiring after the Tokyo Paralympics, but Tokyo was a strange experience due to the pandemic. It was difficult to train, sports venues were closed, and the competition itself had no audience. Back then, ranked second in the world, I believed I had a chance to win gold, but I ended up in third. Many might have thought it was already very impressive, but I was disappointed in myself. That's why I decided to push through for another three years. Though it was tough, I achieved it—I won the silver medal in Paris, ending my career with my best performance and my best image for my supporters."

Daniel's plans for the school to be are deeply rooted in his desire to give back. "Many suggested I become a coach, but I'm the only para-badminton athlete in Hong Kong, so being a coach wouldn't work. Over these years, I've given over 300 speeches, sharing my story to break the stereotype that disabled athletes only receive without contributing. I believe I can create a platform to serve individuals with disabilities, showing that we are full of possibilities—not only helping others but also generating income."

Editor's Note: In November 2024, Daniel Chan Ho Yuen founded "KOMPASS" and officially began offering services, including support for the daily lives of people with disabilities and providing experiences in adaptive sports.

On December 13 of the same year, Daniel announced on social media that he had obtained the Badminton World Federation (BWF) Level 1 Coaching Certification, a qualification that enables him to coach both able-bodied and disabled individuals.

在巴黎殘奧會後，陳浩源宣布退役，但他的旅程遠未結束。他計劃成立一所學院，支持有肢體殘疾或特殊學習需要的人士。

「年齡和傷病是我退役的主要原因。我本來考慮在東京殘奧會後退役，但東京的經歷很奇怪。因為疫情的關係，訓練很困難，場館關閉，整個比賽也沒有觀眾。當時我排名世界第二，自認有機會拿金牌，但最終只得了銅牌。很多人認為這已經很厲害了，但我自己很失望。這就是為什麼我決定再拼三年。雖然過程艱難，但我做到了——在巴黎奪得銀牌，為我的支持者留下了最佳的表現。」

開辦學院的計劃深植於他回饋社會的願望。「很多人建議我當教練，但香港只有我一個輪椅羽毛球運動員，所以當教練行不通。這些年，我做了超過300場演講，分享我的故事，打破那些認為殘疾運動員只能接受幫助而不能回饋社會的刻板印象。我相信我可以創造一個平台，服務殘疾人士，展示我們充滿可能性——不僅幫助他人，還能創造收入。」

編按：在2024年11月，陳浩源成立“KOMPASS”並投入服務，服務內容包括傷殘人士生活以及殘疾運動體驗。同年12月，陳浩源在社交平台宣布獲得國際羽毛球聯合會一級教練課程，該資歷是可以同時教授健全及殘疾人士。



在訪談的最後，陳浩源鼓勵讀者採取行動，實現積極正面的改變。「我認為現在的社會越來越注重口號——說得多，但做得少。很少有人願意實現自己的願景。如果你想成功，記住行動力的重要性。例如，你的目標是100分，但最終只做到70分，那還是70分。但如果你只說不做，結果永遠是零。所以記住，如果你不邁出第一步，就什麼都得不到。不要只是空談——行動才是關鍵。」

陳浩源的故事是一段關於堅韌、決心和希望的旅程。在他人生的新篇章中，他的訊息依舊清晰：通過行動、真實和直面挑戰，任何人都可以實現非凡的成就。

A Call to Action

In closing, Daniel shares a message for readers who wish to make positive changes in their lives: "Society is becoming increasingly focused on slogans—lots of talk but little action. Few are willing to execute their visions. If you want to succeed, remember the importance of execution. For example, if you aim for 100 but only reach 70, you were still able to achieve 70. But if you only talk and never act, the result will always be zero. So, remember, if you don't take the first step, you'll achieve nothing. Avoid being all talk—action is what matters."

Daniel's story is one of resilience, determination, and hope. As he transitions into the next phase of his life, his message remains clear: with action, authenticity, and a willingness to face challenges, anyone can achieve the extraordinary.

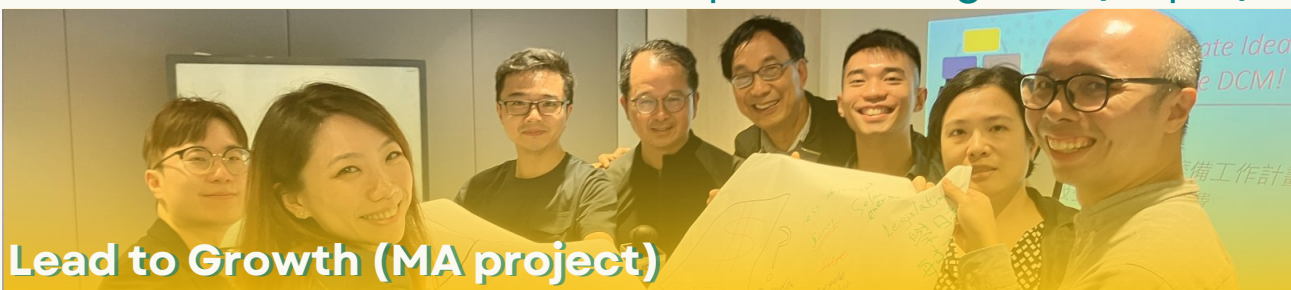

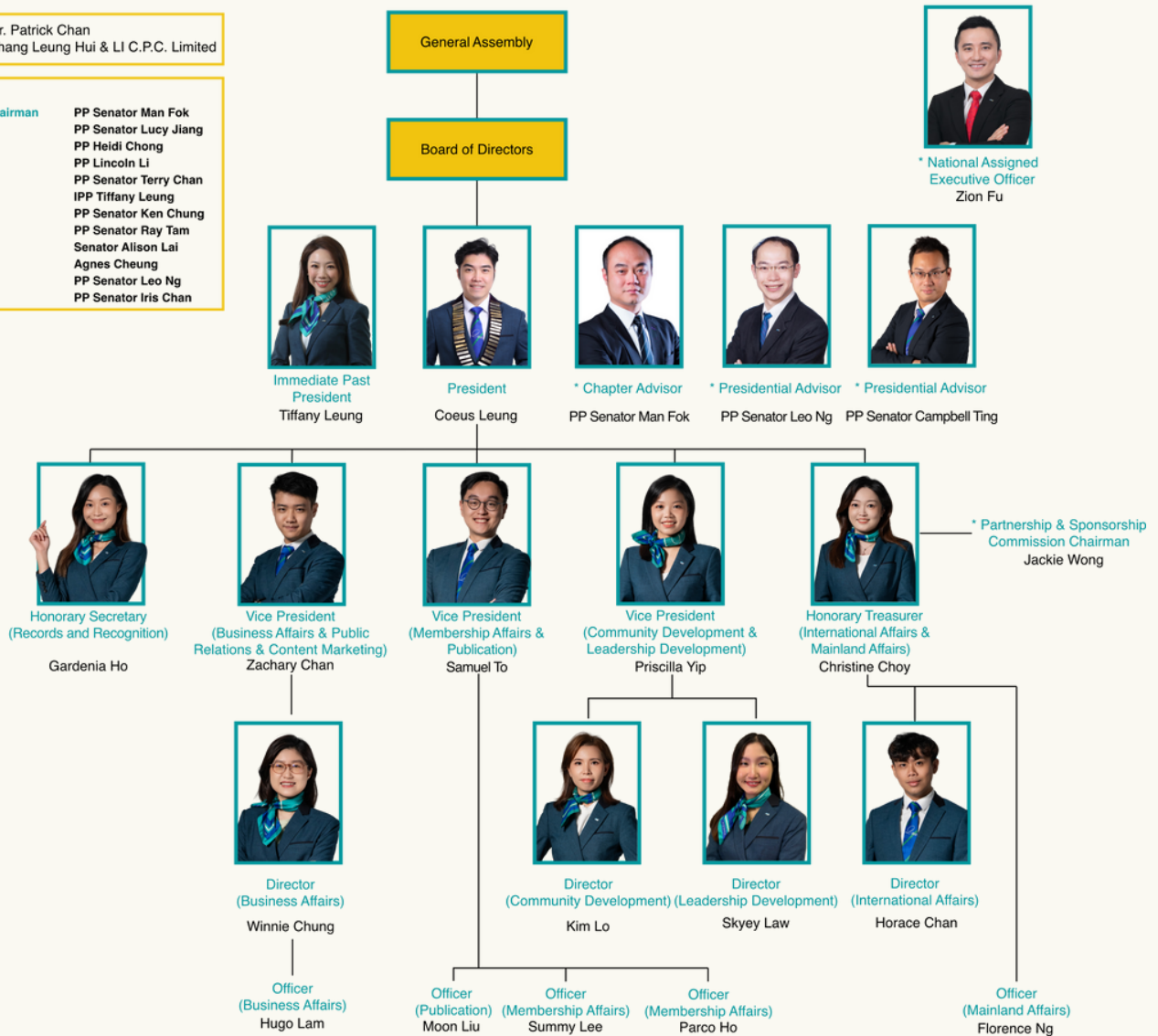
ORGANIZATION CHART OF JUNIOR CHAMBER INTERNATIONAL QUEENSWAY 2025
